

Travel and ETAs: What EU Citizens Need to Know

Electronic Travel Authorisations (ETAs) were introduced for EU nationals in April this year, and will become enforceable in February 2026. However, they are NOT necessary for EU Settlement Scheme (EUSS) status holders, as you will already have an eVisa. You can check your eVisa by logging into your UKVI account.

You can travel to the UK with:

- Passport
- Pre-Settled or Settled Status
- EU national ID card
- Valid vignette, EUSS Family Permit, or Travel Permit




Before You Travel

Make sure your UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) account records are updated with your travel documents.

Keep your share code ready for any checks.

The Home Office advice is not to travel if you have a pending application to the EUSS, this means if you are a Certificate of Application holder. You can look at our <u>Issues' log</u> to see the work the IMA is doing in this area.
